Hveragerdi is located in the south of Iceland in a region which is part of the Hengill central volcano and a 5.000 year lava field. Pillars of steam rise from this geothermally active town, the location of numerous hot springs - the most recent of which are from 2008 - and a geothermal park where you can either dip your feet into natural clay or a hot spring, or boil an egg to enjoy with black bread, locally baked in geothermal ground. Swimming, golfing, hiking, tropical plants in the Arctic, colourful mud and clear water from the new hot springs being thrown into air.
