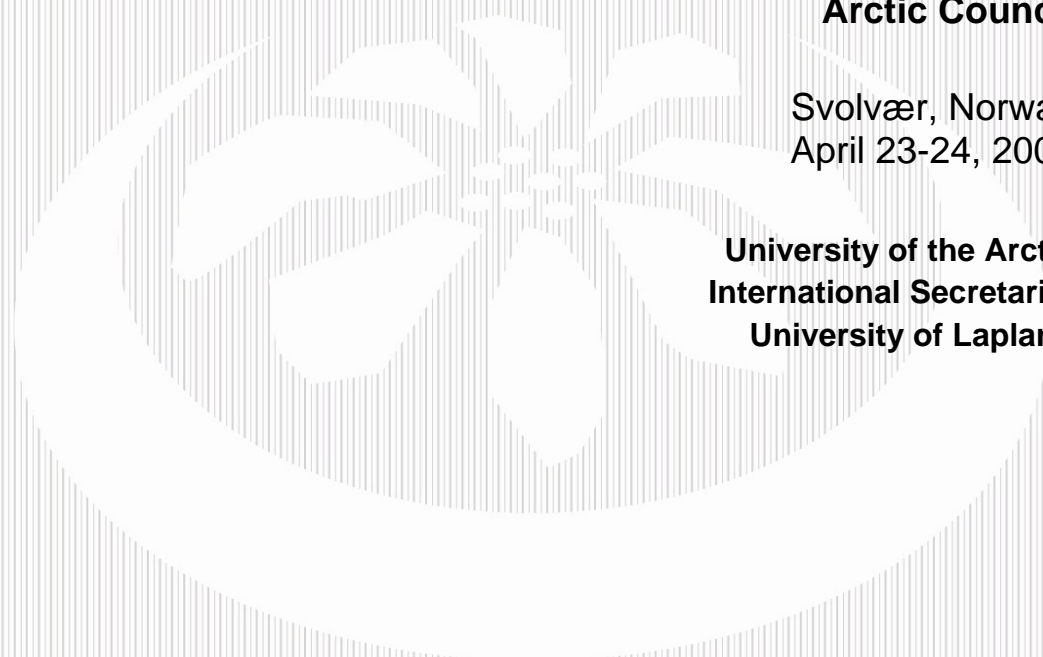

UArctic Governance

At the annual Council meeting in June, nine institutions joined the University of the Arctic, bringing total the total number of members to 110.

UArctic Rectors' Forum

The University of the Arctic held its second Rectors' Forum in Rovaniemi, Finland, from February 27-29, 2008. 75 higher education leaders, representing 33 universities and colleges in the Circumpolar North, gathered at the Forum and collectively passed and signed the University of the Arctic Charter. The Forum was partially held in conjunction with the Standing Committee of Arctic Parliamentarians, with both groups participating in a Seminar focussed on climate change and borders and access to the sea. The Proceedings from the seminar will be published in May 2005 and brought to the UN Treaty event in New York.

Programs

Thematic Networks

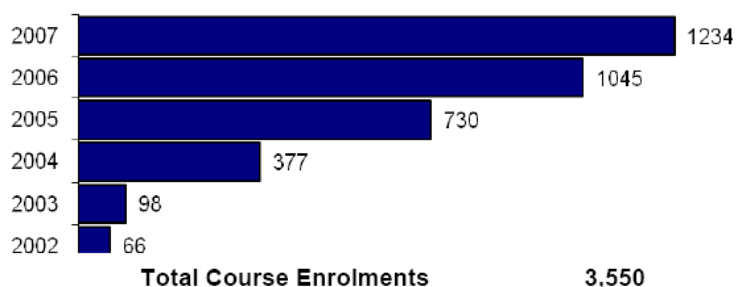
In 2007 three new Thematic Networks were established giving a total number of eleven thematic networks currently in operation: Arctic Medicine; Verdde Program; UArctic Indigenous Thematic Network on Community Based Natural Resource Co-management; Arctic Agriculture and Nature Use; Global Change in the Arctic; Local and Regional Development; World Image of the Indigenous Peoples of the North; Social Work; Northern Governance (2007); Arctic Learning Environment (2007); and Indigenous Arts and Crafts (2007).

The following thematic networks are currently under development: Thematic Network in Arctic Engineering and Science, Thematic Network for Digital and Media Arts, Thematic Network in journalism, Thematic Network in Energy in New Time, Thematic Network in Polar Tourism and Thematic Network on Distance Education and E-learning.

Circumpolar Studies Program

In 2007, Circumpolar Studies course enrolments stabilized in the local on-site courses, while international online course enrolments increased dramatically. The overall increase from 2006 to 2007 was 18%, while the international online course enrolment increased 32% from 230 course enrolments in 2006 to 303 in 2007. To date, Circumpolar Studies has experienced a course enrolment of 3,550.

Graduate Area Development

In early December 2007, six external evaluators unanimously chose the University of Alaska Fairbanks and the University of Lapland to be co-leads of the UArctic Graduate Area. The Graduate Area will be responsible for the development of the Field School, PhD Network, and Future Networks Program. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the joint leads in Rovaniemi on February 26, 2008.

UArctic Catalog and GoNorth

The University of the Arctic also launched its Studies Catalog Office in September, which is based from the Scandinavian Seminar Group in Amherst, USA. The UArctic Studies Catalog is online at www.studies.uarctic.org. The Catalog is of particular importance to the GoNorth initiative which aims marketing the Arctic as a study destination to students from outside the Arctic.

Administration and Management

Information Management

The UArctic website, www.uarctic.org, is managed by the UArctic International Secretariat.

The Shared Voices Newsletter is produced on a monthly basis and distributed to over 2000 readers. One print edition of the Shared Voices Newsletter was produced in May 2007 in cooperation with the GoNorth! Erasmus Mundus project.

In September 2007, the UArctic began to develop an Online Atlas, which will serve as an educative and interactive information tool for students as well as the private sector, based on cooperation among various data holders in the Arctic—including the Arctic Council working groups.

One important avenue to the life and cultures as well as the environment of the Arctic regions is cooking traditions. UArctic Administration started a project to produce a circumpolar cookbook, with Andreas Viestad as the chief author, in 2007. The goal is to produce a cookbook with information about northern cultures, regions as well as flora and fauna relevant for local cooking during 2010.

External Relations

UArctic continued to work closely with the Arctic Council, the Standing Committee of Parliamentarians of the Arctic Region throughout 2007. The collaboration with the Arctic Parliamentarians focused on working together on the planning of the joint seminar of the SCPAR and UArctic Rectors' Forum on February 28, 2008 in Rovaniemi, Finland.

UArctic also maintained a constructive dialogue with the International Arctic Science Committee, the Working Group of Higher Education in the Arctic 8, national funding agencies like the National Science Foundation, the Nordic Council of Ministers as well as the national higher education authorities in the national governments of the eight Arctic Countries. UArctic also started to develop cooperation with UNESCO and the UN University.
